Dear Frau Ruth Alice Schumann,

Charitable Organization "Food For Life Ukraine" (Blagodiyna Organizatsya Yizha Zhyttya) would like to express deep gratitude for a generous donation from Food for Life Deutschland e.V. On September 09, 2025 we have received 3,500 EUR from Food for Life Deutschland e.V. for food distribution for needy people in Ukraine. With this amount of money, we were able to feed more than 1700 needy people.

Estimated cost price of one full meal is 100 UAH, which currently equals to around 2 EUR. We distribute freshly cooked food three times weekly at three different locations in Kyiv simultaneously, and we do address delivery to those, who are not able to arrive at the food distribution locations. Apart from that, with our Quick Response Team we respond to the locations of missile attacks, bringing warm freshly cooked food to feed the victims and the rescue workers. Our organization is a member of a coordination group of the Kyiv City Military Administration for the emergency response and shelling remediation.

Starting from September 09, 2025, we went out for three on-site calls, which were on October 22, 2025, November 29, 2025 and January 21, 2026. Now, after a huge missile attack on January 13, 2026, when our major heat power plants were damaged, Kyiv is experiencing severe electricity cuts, shortage of tap water and central heating. More than 800,000 of the city residents remain without electricity for more than 5 days in a row. Some residential areas are being connected for a short time, but then disconnected again because there is no stable power supply. The disconnection schedules are no longer in effect – the system has switched to emergency disconnections.

We go out to the Points of Resilience, which were deployed around the city, bringing freshly cooked meals to feed people, who cannot cook under the given circumstances. Additionally, our Food for Life kitchen functions mostly on energy from a diesel generator, which makes the costs rise.

Given that, we would highly appreciate any further financial help you may provide, so that we may continue our service to people in Kyiv, who found themselves in challenging life circumstances due to war in Ukraine.
